INSTRUCTORS AND COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Ministerial Counseling, taught by Keith A. Mosher, Sr. [M. Th., D. Min.], is designed to introduce the preacher [in a church setting] to the work of counseling, with emphasis upon knowledge of personality, techniques, and referral.

Advanced Church History I, taught by Daniel F. Cates [B.A., M.A.], is an advanced study in the whole of church history from its beginning to the present.

Principles of Teaching, taught by Curtis A. Cates [M. Th., Ed. D.], is a survey of the need, definition, objectives, teacher qualities, methods, preparation, enthusiasm, motivation, et al., involved in Bible class teaching.

The courses will be of special interest to preachers, elders, Bible class teachers, indeed all Christians. There is no charge for tuition or fees. Registration will take place at the first class meeting, September 2, 2010. Those interested in taking it for university credit should contact the Memphis School of Preaching immediately.
