## REQUIREMENTS:

Each student will be required to pay attention to the instructor, to follow along in the handouts, to do any required reading and assignments outside of class, and to actively participate in class.

Certificate** must write a five page paper [double spaced, Times New Roman 12 pt.] on "A Comparing and Contrasting of the Kings of Israel and Judah," "An Overview of the Mosaic Age," "An Overview of the Patriarchal Age," "Archaeological Support for the Veracity of the Old Testament," "Reasons for Difficulty in Establishing Old Testament Chronology," "Reasons for Difficulty in Establishing Old Testament Geography," or "The Old Testament in Ancient Secular Sources."

Students taking the class for the **M.O.S.T. Advanced Diploma** must write a nine page paper [double spaced, Times New Roman 12 pt.] on "A Comparing and Contrasting of the Kings of Israel and Judah," "An Overview of the Mosaic Age," "An Overview of the Patriarchal Age," "Archaeological Support for the Veracity of the Old Testament," "Reasons for Difficulty in Establishing Old Testament Chronology," "Reasons for Difficulty in Establishing Old Testament Geography," or "The Old Testament in Ancient Secular Sources."

Only students who are **auditing** are exempt from the outside assignments and final exam; however, they may take part if they desire.
